Brothers and sisters,

Last month I wrote to you about the importance of understanding the difference between outreach and evangelism. Understanding this difference is very important if we are to evangelize in a manner consistent with God's word. But there are many other essential aspects of God's truth that we must understand in order to share His Gospel according to His will. One of those essential truths is God's total sovereignty over salvation. That means that God is the creator, the cause, and the One who accomplishes salvation. This is not a work of man but a work of God. It is God that elects the lost to salvation by name before we were ever even born (Rom. 9, Eph. 1:3-4), it is God who calls us to Himself through the Gospel message (Rom. 10:14-15), it is God who regenerates our dead hearts (John 3:3-8), it is God who changes us (1 Peter 1:23), and it is God who justifies, adopts, sanctifies, preserves, and glorifies us (Rom. 5:1-10, 8:15, 1 Thess. 5:23-24, 1 John 2:19, 1 Cor. 15:12-14, Rom. 8:23-25, 30). But if God is the one who does all the work in salvation, doesn't that make our participation unnecessary? By no means! Just as God has ordained the *end* (salvation itself) so too has He ordained the *means* (the preaching and sharing of the Gospel message). This means that we are responsible and accountable to God for communicating the message of the Gospel to others. Theologians call this an *antinomy*, an antimony is an apparent contradiction or a paradox. But it is not a real contradiction. Rather, it appears that way because of our limited knowledge and that causes two truths of God to appear to be at odds when in fact they are perfectly in harmony in the mind and plan of the Lord. Practically, keeping our minds clear about our responsibility to share the Gospel on one hand and God's sovereignty over salvation on the other, means that we will be careful not to either shirk our call to share the Gospel or to act as though the salvation of lost souls is completely dependent upon our words and actions. J.I. Packer makes this point very well in short but very helpful book, "Evangelism and the Sovereignty of God".

*It is right to recognize our responsibility to engage in aggressive evangelism\*. It is right to desire the conversion of unbelievers. It is right to want one's presentation of the gospel to be as clear and forcible\* as possible... But it is not right when we take it on us to do more than God has given us to do. It is not right when we regard ourselves as responsible for securing converts, and look to our own enterprise and techniques to accomplish what only God can accomplish... But this is something that we must not forget, Christ's command means that we all should be devoting all our resources of ingenuity and enterprise to the task of making the gospel known in every possible way to every possible person. Unconcern and inaction with regard to evangelism are always, therefore, inexcusable. And the doctrine of divine sovereignty would be grossly misapplied if we should invoke it in such a way as to lessen the urgency, and immediacy, and priority, and binding constraint, of the evangelistic imperative. (pg. 33-34, 38)*

(\*In the context of the book "aggressive" and "forcible" evangelism do not indicate violence or antagonism. Instead, it is best understood as passionate or bold evangelism.)

...continued from page 2...So, is God alone sovereign over the salvation of sinners? Yes! And are we totally responsible to make sure that the message of the gospel is shared with the lost? Yes! Let these two complementary truths be a source of wonder and awe in your efforts to share Christ with the lost. It is truly amazing to know that God is completely sovereign and unlimited in His capabilities to save to the uttermost and yet He calls you and I to be His ambassadors, to proclaim this incredible message. I pray that this will be fuel in your engine as you seek to share Christ with your unsaved friends, family, neighbors, and even strangers.

### Security Cameras:

I have called the firm that did the electrical installations here at the church but have never gotten any response. The installation of the cameras requires that a coax cable be installed from each camera to the location of the master controller and recorder location and a source of 120 VAC be available at each camera location be connected to power each camera. This requires that the coax cables be installed through the inside of the building to the camera's location. Gerry will provide additional information.

### Bird Problem:

I came up to church and washed the deposits off the wall, door, sidewalk and windows that had been hit. I did not remove the nests at that time as it has been difficult to be environmentally correct in destroy bird nests. We had this problem at the college and when the custodian washed them away a protest resulted so I will install some decoy artificial birds to see if these will solve the problem.
