## Ravings Editorial -

Yes! We do have an opinion now and again.

This one regards communication ... swift communication ... cheap communication ...direct communication. District 4-C1 is among the largest (area-wise) of the sub-districts in all of Lions Clubs International. It is the second largest in MD Four. Yet we rely upon the postal service and word of mouth for most of our communication. Before you all get your shorts in a knot thinking that we are proposing a gigantic email list, please read further. We are of the opinion there is an under use of the Internet, not just within 4-C1, but throughout the entire Multiple District. We have a tool available to us that, when used properly, can provide a forum for any and all Lions information to be distributed to all interested parties. Anyone with an Internet connection can use it ...anytime, to present their message. It may be an informal announcement or it can be a full-blown request for participation with links to other sites. We are talking about the 'Lions Bulletin Board' linked to the MD Four WEB site. This bulletin board has been around, in one form or another, for a long, long time and is visited by Lions from all over.

Yet that is only a small part of what's available. MD Four has an outstanding web site. Yet, there seems to be little

effort by most to avail themselves of this resource. With a few exceptions, even the MD Four Committees and endorsed project don't take advantage of the ability to provide information on this site. They certainly don't use the 'Lions Bulletin Board.' This is all available at "no additional cost" to the members ...It's FREE folks!!! We won't point the finger at anyone in particular. The leaders of our districts; of the endorsed projects; of the various committees ...so on and so forth, are very busy people and most aren't really aware of just how valuable a tool they have. If they did, each district would have an IT (Information Technology) Chair who would be coordinating with the MD Four Chair, along with other interested Lions to keep information up to date and to post new information as it becomes available. Our reasons for bringing this up aren't entirely unselfish. Each month we print close to 200 copies of the district newsletter and mail them to clubs and cabinet. We send approximately 250 emails notifying others of availability of the newsletter online. Life would be so much simpler if we could post one single notice on the bulletin board or have a notification posted on the web site that the newsletter is available. Heck! We could maybe even provide information more often than once a month ...or better yet, the information can be posted directly by the party who is providing it; and on top of that, if anyone has a question, they can ask for and get an answer right there on the bulletin board.

Imagine if the Youth Exchange Program, Lions in Sight, the Lions Eye Foundation, or any of the others were to present their requests for assistance along with links to their web sites to the facilities provided by MD Four where anyone can see it what kind of response they might get. What if they had

actual links to the MD Four WEB site instead of just contact information?

What we're getting at is that, instead of having to wait for a club to receive the district newsletter (which may or may not contain their info) and hoping that the club officer who receives it passes the information along at a meeting which in many cases only occurs twice a month, individual Lions get the message as soon as they view it on the Internet.

The concept is far from perfect because there are still those

The concept is far from perfect because there are still those who aren't connected and probably never will be. But we'll bet that they know someone who is and is vocal enough to pass information along.

You can tell how passionate we feel about this issue because we've already written over 500 words and could probably have gone on and on.

## **Peace Poster Contest**

Each year we have seen more participation in the LCI Peace Poster Contest by the clubs in District 4-C1. Some clubs have expressed that they are having some difficulty getting interest from schools.

Now is the time that art teachers should be approached about the next contest. If we wait until the beginning of the next school year the teachers will have already created their curriculum and it is difficult ... if not virtually impossible for them to rearrange the schedule. So, approach the middle schools about participation and encourage them to include the Peace Poster for the fall term. Then order the materials from LCI and provide them before the end of this year so the teachers and eligible students have all summer to prepare.

Also consider approaching your high schools now about next year's Student Speaker Contest. Don't limit it to English or speech teachers, but also consider Future Farmers of America (FFA) and mock court teams. Some high schools also have Toastmasters clubs which may be interested in participating.

### **GUIDING LION TRAINING**
